Children's Perspectives on School, Teaching and Learning

Developing from the 1970s in the field of social sciences as an intersection of sociology and educational sciences today modern research on children and childhood constitutes an international and interdisciplinary field of research. Focusing on a genuine pedagogical approach to child and childhood research the conference examines children's learning experiences at school and, in a broader view, in their residential environment including also learning opportunities provided by other institutions.

Pedagogical child research in this understanding refers to the children's subjective perspective of school, teaching and learning trying to make them speak about their own experience and view of their learning processes. One of the new focuses in pedagogical child research is the role of embodiment in learning and teaching.

Pedagogical child research is referring to the tradition of phenomenological methodology but aims on developing solid qualitative methodologies for an empirical research approach which constitutes a main focus of the conference.
