Course Outline

Artificial intelligence (AI) is presently "one of the most popular buzzwords in the field of digital language teaching" (Strasser 2021). This seminar addressed the purposes, promises, potentials, and challenges of AI in relation to foreign language learning and teaching.

Participating students immersed themselves in online language learning environments and data used for learning analytics in the first part of the seminar.

In the second part of the seminar, students collaboratively developed, conducted, and evaluated their own research projects related to the teaching and learning of foreign languages and artificial intelligence. A 4-week teaching unit was successfully tested with 10th grade students of English as a Foreign Language at a local grammar school.

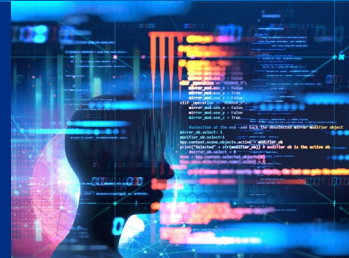

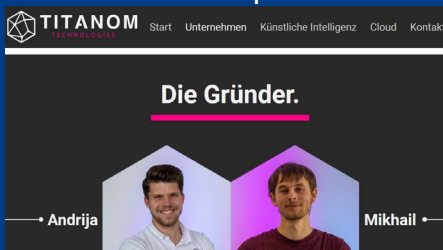
