From Input to Conversation

The Walk & Talk conference format combines short presentations, informal conversation in motion, and a concluding exchange with the presenters.

This program part schedules short inputs, followed by the Walk & Talk in the Hofgarten and a discussion over coffee at the high-top tables outside the Sommerresidenz.

The session begins with two 15-minute presentations. At the end of each presentation, the speakers will introduce guiding questions for the discussion.

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Guiding Questions:

- In your view, how can the CCU further promote impactful research collaboration on topics (e.g., humane technology, healthcare for the vulnerable, care for our common home, human rights), which are important to Catholic Universities?
- What are one or two milestones for CCU's collaborative research endeavors? (i.e., how will we know if the CCU is strengthening the impact of our research collaboration)
- What responsibility do students, faculty, and staff have for fostering a sustainable university culture?
- Mobility contributes significantly to the universities' greenhouse gas emissions. How can we achieve less emissions through a more sustainable way of travelling and / or discuss mobility by far more critical?
