Speaking of semesters abroad: If you wish to spend one or two semesters abroad in the academic year 2023/24 – as you know, such a study abroad is not obligatory, but it makes sense from the course of studies (especially in the third semester) as well as with regard to the topic of the program – you should start planning as soon as possible.

Study MIB also in English

Since the introduction of the new examination regulations for the MIB last year, it has become even easier to complete all or a part of the Master's program in English. This not only increases the flexibility of content for German-speaking students, but also strengthens their competence in the central working, research and teaching language of International Relations. In the future, it will also open up the MIB to international applicants even more than before.

But how does studying the MIB in English actually look like? Since the number of courses in English offered at KU is (still) limited, there are a number of aspects to consider. However, some things are already possible:

- Required module: In the modules Theories, Structures and Order as well as Practice, Strategies and Fields of International Politics, a course in English can be chosen. For several years, we have offered a seminar in both German and English with an accompanying exercise. Each semester there are also one or more options of courses in English for the module from Studium.Pro at KU.
- Internship: The compulsory internship can, of course, be completed in an English-speaking country or context. The required internship report shall be written in English accordingly.
- Required Elective Component: Here, we recommend the modules completely
 in English like *Model United Nations* and *International Law* as well as other
 English-language courses, especially in Modern History and Sociology
 (*Advanced Sociological Theories*). Furthermore, if necessary, academic
 achievements in English from a study abroad can be credited to modules of KU
 after prior consultation.
- Elective Component: Students can choose master's modules in English from the entire range of subjects offered at KU. In particular, language courses from the offer of the Language Center are recommended here, if applicable, in the interest of integration into university life as well as in preparation for studying abroad.
- Master's Thesis: The master's thesis can also be written in English after consultation with the supervisor.

The program management is committed to gradually expanding the offer of Englishlanguage courses in the MIB and thus further widening the possibilities for choice.

Student Spotlight - Alla Petrova

How can MIB studies look like? Alla Petrova (photo: private), currently in her fifth semester, tells her experience below:

"I started my studies during the Corona pandemic. Nevertheless, I felt very comfortable in Eichstätt and enjoyed my courses. The combination of theoretical and practical courses at MIB provides both in-depth and extensive knowledge, as well as useful skills for working in the field of international relations. Especially exciting for me was the seminar Security Studies, where different challenges in global politics were analyzed. With the help of this seminar, I learned an internationally used structure of writing reports with policy recommendations, which I find very practical and am currently using in my master's thesis.

During my MIB studies, I also completed two internships at the UN: My first internship was in the UNHCR Liaison Office with the OSCE and other UN organizations. With the help of this experience, I was able to gain insights into both international organizations and follow current discussions in the OSCE. My tasks included creation of summaries of OSCE discussions and reports for relevant UNHCR country offices.




The second internship was at UNIDO, the UN Industrial Development Organization, where I helped in the Policymaking Organs Secretariat. There, I expanded my knowledge in the field of international development cooperation and was involved in preparation of events as well as engagement with non-member states of the organization. With the deepened knowledge of international relations that I obtained thanks to the MIB studies, I successfully completed two internships at the UN. Currently, I am pursuing a career in human rights, where I have many opportunities with my MIB studies. Finally, I would like to thank the MIB professors and coordinators for their excellent work and support."



Last but not least... – General renovation of the KU collegiate buildings is due to begin in 2023

Recently, the university management provided information about an upcoming major project for the KU, the planning and preparations for which have been underway for many years: the general renovation of the college buildings. The first preparations for this will begin in the fall, and construction work on the renovation of the first two building complexes will start in the middle of the next year. In three construction phases, the old buildings, with their seminar rooms, lecture halls and offices, will be modernized and brought up to the latest technical standards by 2028 – all of this, of course, with as few restrictions as possible for studying and teaching at the Eichstätt campus.
