




## TOURISM FUTURES in a post COVID-19 world: Australian Evidence and International Perspectives

COVID-19 presents the tourism industry with a scenario that has challenged the very essence of travel. While the tourism industry has adapted and Australia's success in handling the pandemic has allowed a certain continuity of operation, there is still a long way to go to achieve full recovery. Immersed in this context, the "Tourism Futures Event: Australian Evidence and International Perspectives" will mark the official launch of the first annual report released by Australia's South West Sustainable Tourism Observatory, inevitably with a strong focus on COVIDrecovery research. To complement the Observatory report launch, the event will draw on the expertise of international keynote speakers who will share their perspectives on tourism recovery in Europe, the UK, the Maldives and China.
