#### Foundation & mission

The Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt (KU) is a staterecognized UNIVERSITY UNDER CHURCH SPONSORSHIP. It is open to students of all faiths and beliefs.

The institution was granted university status on April 1, 1980, by the Bavarian bishops on the basis of the Concordat between the Free State of Bavaria and the Holy See and with the approval of the Congregation for Catholic Education. Its roots can be traced back to the 16<sup>th</sup> century.

The mission of a Catholic university is to dedicate itself to the truth unconditionally. The KU fulfills this mission in scientific autonomy and **FREEDOM OF RESEARCH AND TEACHING**.





#### **Profile & vision**

We consider our University as a **PLACE OF EXCELLENT RESEARCH**. The KU provides its researchers with outstanding working conditions. Fundamental research and science with a practical orientation are assigned equal status. The KU actively supports the promotion of early-career researchers and offers them ample room for their scientific qualification.

The KU understands sustainable development as a form of development that is balanced on an ecological, economical and sociocultural level and takes **GLOBAL AND INTERGENERATIONAL FAIRNESS** into account.

EQUALITY in all its facilities and decision-making processes and supports career development of women in a special way.
