

Program highlights

Dates: Monday, July 1st to Friday, July 5th

Credits: 4 ECTS for 25 teaching hours – 5 hours per day **Location:** BSB Dijon campus, 29 rue Sambin, 21000 Dijon

- Innovative learning approaches beyond traditional leadership theory that encourage authenticity, action, and the courage to seek one's true leadership identity.
- Official Process Communication Model (PCM) test included in the program
- The Emergence Play (The King's & Queen's Play), leadership training method created by the French therapist Dominique Vincent allowing individuals and groups to develop their internal and external leadership skills – in order to 'lead' their life and other people in a most fulfilling way.
- One-day outdoor adventure to put new skills into action
- Extracurricular cultural activities every day.



What will you learn?

The program allows students to develop their personal leadership potential and better access their potential in their professional and personal life.

It has a strong focus on **personal development** and **soft skills**. It aims to stimulate people-centered leadership based on students' awareness of their personal strengths, morals and unique qualities. We will also build on the group dynamic to create an environment where students can learn from each other through in-depth interactions and discussions.

- Become aware of your unique leadership qualities and areas of Improvement.
- Be an authentic and people-centered leader.
- Understand your personality using the unique process communication model (PCM).
- How to respect your and other peoples' psychological needs to diminish stress and communicate successfully.



Program organization

Day 1: Introduction & Process Communication Model IUnderstanding my personality profile; increasing efficiency of my communication.

Day 2: Process Communication II & Co-active leadership
Second gear: understanding my psychological needs,
managing interaction difficulties & strengths; understanding
the multiple dimensions of how to lead.

Day 3: Systemic leadership tool: The Emergence Play Understanding the deeper connection between me and my team; learning the keys to keep evolving as a leader.

Day 4: Outdoor team leadership & debriefing

During this day, predefined teams will complete several outdoor challenges to learn about their team leadership abilities. The day will end with a debriefing by the lake.

Day 5: Reinventing organizations

Putting my learning into a bigger & future perspective: Concretely, how can I help my organization evolve? How can I make use of my strengths as a leader?



Program assessment

- **1. Learning & leadership diary** (individual assignment) A report on my learning journey as a leader throughout the program.
- 2. Team assignment
 A team poster: Based on the outdoor experience.

Who can apply?

Prerequisites:

- Solid English language level and sufficient social skills to connect with students from different countries and disciplines.
- Previous working experience (2 years +).
- Open mindedness towards innovative learning approaches and action learning.
- Sufficient personal maturity to embrace the level of introspection and personal development that is part of the program.

Transformative Pathways in Consumption





Program highlights

Dates: Monday, July 1st to Friday, July 5th

Credits: 4 ECTS for 25 teaching hours – 5 hours per day

Location: BSB Lyon campus, 37 Rue Saint-Romain, 69008

Lyon

This interdisciplinary course integrates transformative learning methodologies to delve deeply into key pillars of sustainability, including energy conservation, sustainable travel and transportation, or sustainable diets and waste management. Through critical analysis, scholarly discourse, and practical application, participants will engage with complex sustainability challenges, developing a nuanced understanding of their social, economic, and environmental dimensions. Led by esteemed faculty, this course equips participants with the knowledge, skills, and mindset necessary to enact meaningful change in their personal lives, professional endeavors, and broader communities.



What will you learn?

- Integrate interdisciplinary knowledge to understand the role of consumer behavior in shaping patterns of consumption and their impact on sustainability.
- Analyze the interplay between social, economic, and environmental factors in sustainability.
- Apply transformative and collaborative learning techniques to personal sustainability behaviors.
- Evaluate existing practices and policies in sustainability domains.
- Develop practical skills for implementing sustainable practices.
- Formulate a personal action plan for sustainable living.

Program assessment

Personal growth essay that reflects on the student's journey of transformative learning throughout the course and develops a comprehensive action plan for advancing sustainability in their personal and professional life. The essay should include interdisciplinary knowledge on consumer behavior, be well-documented, drawing on reputable sources to support their arguments and illustrated with relevant personal life examples..



Who can apply?

Prerequisites:

- Solid English language level and sufficient social skills to connect with students from different countries and disciplines.
- Applicants will be asked to submit a brief statement of interest outlining their motivation for taking the course, their background or experiences related to sustainability, and their goals for participation.





Dijon


- **5-days** starting on Monday, July 8th and ending on Friday, July 12th.
- 25 teaching hours 5 hours per day 4 ECTS.
- Human Centered Design Thinking (HCDT) innovation method originally defined by the consulting company IDEO applied to a real existing problem.
- Local real-life company mission
- Coach with 10-years of international consulting experience.
- Extracurricular cultural activities every day.



What will you learn?

There is no problem without a context! If we take the time and effort to explore it, the real problem will appear together with the best possible solution/s. **Human Centered Design Thinking** (HCDT) is an innovation method that makes an essential 'detour' called EMPATHY to explore the needs of people involved in a problem, or capable of providing inspiration to solve the problem before jumping to the solution of the problem. During this program "Human Centered Design Thinking" will be applied to a local real-life company mission.

- Look beyond the surface of a problem and identify its real sources.
- Take an authentic and empathy-based perspective on a problem.
- Engage creatively with one's environment.
- Select, create and use qualitative research methods for innovation purposes.
- Select and apply creativity techniques appropriately.
- Generate powerful and innovative solutions.




Program organization

- **Day 1:** Introduction to Design Thinking & Presentation of the Company Mission.
- **Day 2:** Research Understanding the Problem through the lenses of Empathy.
- Day 3: Analysis Putting together all pieces of the puzzle.
- Day 4: Creative Problem solving & Prototyping.
- Day 5: Testing & Presenting the solutions to the Company

Program assessment

- 1. HCDT diary (individual assignment)

 A 2-page report (1000 words max) on my learning journey as a design thinking consultant throughout the summer school.
- 2. Team presentation (Day 5, team assignment)
 Oral presentation to the company (documented in form of a ppt presentation).



Who can apply?

Prerequisites:

- Undergraduate and postgraduate students from any discipline.
- Open mindedness towards innovative learning approaches and action learning.
- Solid English language level and sufficient social skills to connect with students from different countries and disciplines.
- A basic level of personal maturity to embrace the level of introspection and personal development that is part of the program.

... and a whole day trip to Burgundy vineyards...

This visit will involve several cultural activities, such as a visit to the famous Hôtel-Dieu: mediaeval hospital for the poor in Beaune; or a visit to the Château du Clos de Vougeot: the emblem of Burgundy wines. Visit of a mustard manufacture, wine tasting and lunch in a restaurant.

The bus trip departing from Dijon is open to all participants of the Summer School and it must be funded separately.

Detailed schedule of the trip will be provided utterly.

The trip will only take place if there is a minimum of 12 participants.



Accommodation

BSB can help you with accommodation booking for your summer school.

In Dijon, we suggest the **Aparthotel Adagio République**, located in the center of Dijon and just minutes' walk from BSB campus. This is a 3-star hotel apartment, and rooms are equipped with a small kitchenette. Breakfast will be included in the reservation.

In Lyon, we suggest **Lagrange apart'hotel - Lyon Lumière,** located just minutes' walk from BSB Campus. This is a 4-star hotel apartment, and rooms are equipped with a small kitchenette. Breakfast will be included in the reservation.

Please note the cost of accommodation is not included in the cost of the program and must be funded separately. Using this accommodation is optional.
