Since 2010, the Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt (KU) has been committed to following the guiding principles of sustainability in research, teaching, and campus management. Its aim is to ensure that the University and the future decision-makers that study here make a contribution to sustainable development in society by using resources sparingly and efficiently, and treating one another and our environment with respect and responsibility.

Principles

The KU promotes its employees' sense responsibility towards each other and the environment, and encourages them to play a part in sustainable development.

It defines ecological, social, and economic areas that are to be addressed over the course of each year in an annual sustainable action plan and as part of the EMASplus auditing process.

All members of the University are encouraged to make suggestions, share ideas, and help implement its sustainability goals.

Education for sustainable development is integrated into teaching and learning to ensure that students develop the skills that they need to play an active role in sustainable development in our society. The KU specifically welcomes research projects on topics related to sustainability.

The University promotes sparing and socially responsible use of resources on campus and encourages its members to use environmentally friendly means of transport. Furthermore, the KU supports sustainable development in the region and the rest of the world.
